The prospective lecturer's duties include teaching language courses equivalent to at least 16 hours per week (levels A1 to B1). He/she shall also be specialised in one of the relevant fields in German as a Foreign Language: (applied) linguistics, didactics, German cultural studies, phonetics.

The implementation and further development of the B.A. programme are in close cooperation with Herder-Institute, University of Leipzig, funded by DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) since 2011. Working in an international team at German Department of Salahaddin University Hawler is the ideal career launch pad for recent university graduates, particularly for gathering extensive teaching experiences.

Required qualifications:

- a master's degree in German as a Foreign Language or a similar qualification in this field of study,
- an advanced or native command of written and spoken German,
- experience in teaching German as a foreign language
- teaching experience at secondary schools and/or at universities is of advantage,
- experience in developing teaching materials as well as planning and conducting written and oral exams,
